So we have the line made up just hasn't been changed over yet. So then we moved over to the china and what we did is, Helen filled up a jug with.

So we were able to drop the well, we didn't drop the line on the but we put a we put a white jug on it for the winter. And then we moved over to the Annie yesterday. So, we removed the conical boy, that was on it. And We put another jug on it, so that's another line that needs to be replaced in the spring.

So and then we moved over to the Florence and we did the same thing there. So that was, those are the three that have temporary jugs on them for the winter. We'll see if they survive, and we'll go from there.
